



What you'll need to show to access certain indoor businesses and settings starting September 22:





Proof of vaccination

Proof of identity



The City of Port Colborne is committed to ensuring the health and safety of residents and staff. As the province continues to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic, effective September 22 the following City facilities will require people to be fully vaccinated and provide proof of their vaccination status, along with photo ID, to gain access.

Vale Health & Wellness Centre:

- Any adult (18+) accessing the facility for any purpose, including parents or guardians of youth participating in an organized sport, walkers and the general public.
- Youth (12+) that are spectating and not actively participating.
- COVID-19 screening will also be in effect for all individuals entering the building.

Youth under 18 years of age actively participating in an organized sport, including training, practices, games and competitions, patrons with a medical exemption, and workers or volunteers (including coaches and officials) are not required to provide proof of vaccination at the Vale Health & Wellness Centre. Individuals can provide proof of immunization by downloading or printing their vaccine receipt from the provincial booking portal https://covid19.ontariohealth.ca/, or by calling the Provincial Vaccine Booking Line at 1-833-943-3900. Those with medical exemptions must provide proof as identified by the province in order to access facilities. For more information visit portcolborne.ca/covid19.

Digital Main Street launches in Port Colborne

Through renewed investment in Digital Main Street's Ontario Grants Program (OGP), the City of Port Colborne has received \$19,000 to help local small businesses with digital transformation. Small businesses in Port Colborne can register now at digitalmainstreet.ca to receive a free assessment and access to online training modules at no cost. The cornerstone of Digital Main Street is its squad of trained specialists



who deliver personalized, one-onone technological assistance. This includes support for basic website set-up, Google My Business profiles, 360° photos, social media presence and much more. These specialists can also provide information on the ShopHERE program for digital storefront or e-commerce set-up and assist with applications for a one-time \$2,500 grant to implement a Digital Transformation Plan (DTP).

Curbside and in-person browsing will continue, with the following hours:

- Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday: 10 a.m. 7 p.m.
- Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday: 10 a.m. 4 p.m.

Public computers will be available for 60-minute sessions, during the following hours:

- Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday: 10 a.m. 7 p.m.
- Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday: 10 a.m. 4 p.m.

Proof of vaccination is not required to access curbside pickup, in-person browsing, or to use public computers.

Entry will be by capacity and masks are required. All visitors to the library will be actively screened prior to entry into the building in accordance with municipal requirements. There is no in-person programming at this time.




History Chasers Club!




