COMMUNITY UPDATES

Port Colborne, along with the rest of Ontario, moved to Step 3 of the Roadmap to Reopen on Friday, July 16. In response to evolving data around the Delta variant and based on the recent experiences of other jurisdictions, the government, in consultation with Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health, is pausing the exit from the Roadmap to Reopen. Health experts will continue to monitor the data to determine when it is safe to exit the Roadmap and lift the majority of public health and workplace safety measures currently in place. Lockview Park Redevelopment Online Survey

The City of Port Colborne is seeking resident input on the redevelopment of Lockview Park. City staff will review the poll's results and finalize a concept plan before going to Council for their approval in early fall.

Reconnect to Rediscover Niagara

Niagara municipalities are teaming up to invite residents to get out and rediscover their region.

With COVID-19 restrictions slowly lifting, recreation and leisure teams from the City of St. Catharines, Fort Erie, Port Colborne, Niagara Falls, Welland, Pelham, West Lincoln, Lincoln, Niagara-on-the-Lake, Thorold, Grimsby and the Niagara Parks Commission, are joining together to host Reconnect to Rediscover Niagara from noon, Aug. 27 to midnight, Sept. 6. 




Coming Soon

Virtual History School-Based Project

The Port Colborne Historical & Marine Museum is creating a new virtual based engagement opportunity for school-aged students. This project aims to get students to learn about, interact with, and create a deeper connection to living history items. Students will experience the virtual grounds tour through Microsoft Teams. We encourage teachers, early childhood educators, and any interested participant to sign up! Students will learn about and engage with living history items and with provided Museum activity kits, will participate in hands-on learning like the multi-discipline science and history experiment; using homemade ink! Following this experience, each student will receive a Port Colborne Museum History Passport Activity Booklet. This will give students a chance to continue their learning in a fun and engaging way. Exploring Flora in the Fall!

This coming September, the Port Colborne Historical and Marine Museum will be offering a new interactive QR code feature on its grounds. Staff and volunteers have worked hard to identify, research, and photograph the natural f lora found on Arabella's Cultural Block. The gathered information will be accessible through QR code plaques placed around the grounds for all visitors to enjoy! Through this platform, we hope to offer a safe and educational experience while also encouraging environmental awareness.

Now Available: Online Digital Exhibit

Enjoy the new online Port Colborne Historical & Marine Museum digital exhibit from the comfort of your own home!

This new exhibit will highlight the work of Edward and Albert Graf, a father-son team of weavers who lived and worked in Gasline between 1845 and 1920. OurOntario, is a website designed to help digitize museum collections across Ontario, and will be hosting this online exhibit. Included in this exhibit is the Graf jacquard coverlets, wool blankets, rag carpets, and a number of photographs of the Graf family. This exhibit is part of a larger ongoing series of projects to digitize the museum experience in the wake of COVID-19. However, the value of the online exhibit goes beyond the pandemic. With the goal of making the Port Colborne Historical & Marine Museum's collection available to the community, this digital exhibit is only the first step. By putting the Graf collection online, it will be more accessible to researchers and anyone looking to explore the interesting history of settler textiles produced locally. Behind the Scenes

A busy aspect of museum work happens behind the scenes dealing with the collection. Storing and ensuring artifacts are safe, is a year-round task. Environments must be monitored to ensure proper exposure to humidity, light, heat, and more. The museum team is busy working away to protect the items in the collection for centuries to come. Over the last year, in-person visits have slowed due to the pandemic which has allowed museum staff more time to organize the collections and conduct background research. Our new Registrar, Amanda Emery, is continuing this work with her first official donation. This black and white photograph of Smith's Store and Post Office in Sherkston brings to life a long history of rural stores. This store and post office was owned in the early 1900s by G.W. Smith and was a busy place in Sherkston. The 8 p.m. mail train would arrive with plenty of people waiting around to collect their mail. Local stores and post offices were places to socialize and share news during the time. G.W. Smith also expanded to delivering his groceries, something we came to appreciate in the past year!
