COMMUNITY UPDATES

Port Colborne, along with the rest of Ontario, moved to Step 1 of the Roadmap to Reopen on Friday, June 11. The Roadmap to Reopen is a three-step plan to safely and cautiously reopen the province and gradually lift public health measures. The province will remain in Step 1 for at least 21 days to evaluate any impacts on key public health and health system indicators. Household-only dining restriction now lifted in Niagara
