Beach passes! Port Colborne residents will be able to pick up their free beach pass starting in May. A beach pass gives residents access to both Nickel Beach and Centennial-Cedar Bay Beach for free.

Niagara residents and non-Niagara residents will be required to preregister online prior to accessing Nickel Beach. If the beach is already at parking capacity, beachgoers will not be able to preregister.
